A Little Background Information...

Confirmation is: one of the three Sacraments of Initiation. It continues a process of full membership in the Church that was begun at Baptism. Confirmation strengthens and celebrates the presence of God's Spirit in our lives.

At St. Patrick's, preparation for Confirmation is a two-year process for young people in high school as requested by our Archdiocese. The Confirmation program uses a curriculum that fosters the development of knowledge and maturity needed for an adult level of participation in all areas of parish life. At the conclusion of this program there is a beginning of complete membership in the parish community. Each part of the series focuses on different aspects of community and different levels of understanding of the Catholic Faith. In addition there will be a strong emphasis on Catholic Social Teaching and the need for regular charity in our Christian lifestyle.

General Expectations ...

Candidates are expected to participate in Family Faith Formation sessions for their age level during both ninth and tenth grades. They are also expected to complete service and participation requirements as listed in this resource booklet. Candidates must also choose an appropriate sponsor to help them on their journey by working with them, praying for them, and being able to support their decision that they are ready to fully join the Church (see page 4 for sponsor details). Finally, candidates must decide if they are ready to commit to fully joining the Church, and, if they are, receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the spring of tenth grade. Confirmation is to be the beginning of an active life as an adult member of the Church- a joining ceremony. Confirmation is not the end, but rather a beginning of life long active faith.

Parents/Guardians are expected to help their child focus on what is expected as a candidate, support and pray for their child, and do any "at home" work requested. While parents should encourage their child to want to be a full member of the Church, the young person should be allowed to make the final decision themselves about whether or not they are currently ready to fully commit to adult membership, participation and responsibility in the Church. During the two years of preparation, parents can help the young people make useful service choices, attend Mass and parish events and see the ways that belonging to a parish are important to the family. At the end of this time, the young person must determine their readiness for Confirmation.

Candidates in C1 & C2: In order to be Confirmed, the family of the candidate must be members of the parish. This is a Church expectation- not just a St. Patrick's expectation. The candidate must have already received the Sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation and Eucharist. A Baptismal certificate must be on file in the office. If the candidate was **NOT** baptized at St. Patrick's Church please provide a photocopy of the original Baptismal Certificate from the parish where the candidate was baptized. A copy may be obtained by calling the parish of baptism and requesting a copy. The candidate must then complete all the requirements of the program. If he/she decides not to be Confirmed at the end of the program, please contact the Faith Formation Office.

LEVEL 2- in more detail

Confirmation Level 2 (C2): usually happens in 10th grade but can be later if desired/needed. In addition to attending the regular formation sessions for their level (approximately 12 sessions), the candidates do the following:

- Focus on the Creed, why they want to belong to the Church, the place of faith in their lives, etc.
- Focus on the Sacraments and understanding their role in the Church
- Complete the information form on Page 7 of this packet
- Parents will complete the consent form for the C2 retreat on page 8 of this packet
- Complete the Saint Report on page 9 of this packet
- Remain in contact with your sponsor after each and every session
- Complete 3 **different** service projects as outlined on page 5 and corresponding sheets on pages 11, 13 & 15 of this packet
- Attend weekly Mass
- Attend sessions and retreats as listed on the Faith Formation calendar
- Attend the schedule C2 retreat. **If a make-up retreat is necessary, it must be scheduled with the Director of Youth Ministry. Additional retreat costs will be paid by the candidate's family.**
- Attend final Confirmation meeting with sponsors on **Tuesday, April 29, 2020**
- Attend the sending Ceremony on Sunday, May 10th 2020 at the 10:30 AM Mass**
- Complete an interview with the pastor to determine readiness for reception of the Sacrament. Interview preparation questions are on page 17 of this packet.

Attendance/Calendar: All required formation sessions and Confirmation meetings, events, and retreats are listed on the master formation calendar. This calendar is available on line at www.churchofstpatrick.com. We understand that young people must sometimes be absent due to illness. Please notify the faith formation office as far in advance as possible, make up any work immediately, and make absences as rare an occurrence as possible. **Families with high absenteeism will be contacted to determine a solution to the situation. Confirmation may be postponed if there is a high level of absenteeism.**

Sponsor: A sponsor will need to be selected at the beginning of the C1 year. Sponsors will help the candidates prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation through discussion and their willingness to act as a role model. It is important for candidates and sponsors to discuss their faith often before the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Who can be a sponsor? Given the nature of the sacrament of Confirmation as a Sacrament of Initiation, and its close relationship with Baptism, sponsors will need to stay in close contact with the candidates as they move through the remainder of the preparation. **At the completion of the process the sponsor will be required to present the candidate to the Catholic Church community as fully prepared to enter into the community as an adult member. This can only be done through regular contact and dialogue after each and every session.**

Please note:

- Given the guidelines of Canon Law a sponsor cannot be a parent of the candidate
- The sponsor must be an active practicing Catholic 16 years or older, and received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation
- The sponsor must be an excellent model of adult Catholic living in the world
- Sponsors will be asked to attend with the candidate 3 different sessions:
 - Wednesday, December 4, 2019 at 6:30 PM
 - Wednesday, February 19, 2020 at 6:30 PM
 - Wednesday, April 29, 2020 at 6:30 PM (C2 Only) at St. Patrick's Church

- Sponsors will be asked to attend the Sending Ceremony on Sunday, May 10, 2020 at 10:30 AM Mass at St. Patrick's Church.
- If a sponsor is unable to attend a sponsor session, a parent should come in the sponsor's place.

Confirmation Service Opportunity:

Due to the importance of the regular practice of service in the lives of active Catholic adults all C1 and C2 learners will be required to complete **3 different service entries** of community service each year, 3 during the C1 year and 3 during the C2 year. Through the positive exercise of this service opportunity you should learn the value of regular service, and thus be prompted to partake in future service experiences.

The guidelines are:

- Three (3) service experiences must be completed in each of the 3 areas:
 - 1 service experience in the candidate's family
 - 1 service experience for a non-profit organization
 - 1 service experience for the candidate's current parish (St. Patrick's Church)
- Please see the included service sheets for detailed instructions on each service category.
- There needs to be a connection between who we are as Christians and the motives behind each of the service experiences.
- **Although admirable, membership on sports teams does not fulfill the service opportunity.**
- The candidates need to be able to complete a service entry form for **each service experience** answering the questions on the form in complete coherent sentences.
- Service events will be scheduled by SPY and promoted on the SPY website as well as during Faith Formation sessions.
- Candidates are welcome to attend SPY events or find other service opportunities on their own.
- If you are unsure about service sites, please ask.
- Do not wait until the last minute, please plan ahead.

Confirmation Names: As Catholics, we look to people of great faith and spirituality as role models in our daily living. Since Confirmation allows you to enter into a greater participation of your faith, you should look to this group of diverse individuals and choose a saint with personal and spiritual characteristics you would like to incorporate in your life. During this Confirmation process, you will need to choose a Confirmation name. You will carry that Catholic saint's name with you during your Confirmation ceremony. **This saint's name will be your Confirmation name.**

Interviews: Interviews will be scheduled with the pastor during the spring of the Level 2 year. The purpose of the interview is for candidates to make a statement on their desire to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Interviews are also a way to connect with candidates to better understand the process and their plans after Confirmation. Students should prepare a statement of their understanding of what it means to be an adult in the Catholic Church. They will also present their work (service work and saint report) from the past year. All times will be scheduled using a sign-up genius website. Use the interview preparation sheet on page 17 to prepare for the interview.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. *How many hours of service do I need to do?*

A. There is no set number of hours. You are required to perform service a **minimum** of 6 separate times, 3 **during** your C1 year and 3 **during** your C2 year. They must fulfill the requirements of the 3 separate categories listed on the service forms.

Q. *I already volunteer for a sport that I participate in. Can I just use that?*

A. No. A service project should be completed using the guidelines listed on the services forms.

Q. *I did all my requirements, but I didn't fill out any forms. Do I really have to fill them all out?*

A. Yes. During the Confirmation process, we are trying to assess whether or not you are prepared for adult life in the faith. When you participate in the different aspects of the program, you are demonstrating preparation for an active Catholic adult lifestyle; we need to be sure that you understand why you are doing what you are doing.

Q. *The person I want for my sponsor lives out of town. Is that okay?*

A. Yes, as long as they meet the sponsor requirements listed earlier in this packet. All of the sponsor information can be done over the phone, but it is very important that they are present for the Confirmation Ceremony. Please bring a parent or other adult to sit in at sessions in the sponsor's place.

Q. *Why is this program two years long?*

A. The Confirmation process is a two year process for a few important reasons. This program is based on the understanding that learners will grow and mature over the different years they attend the program. When all learners enter the C1 year, each has similar foundations in Faith Formation. Through consistent encouragement and relationships with each learner the program seeks the development of candidates into mature active Catholic adults. Faith Formation is not something that can be rushed, nor can learners test out of sessions. The value in each session, retreat, and gathering is the discussion and growth within a community of believers, an aspect central to our Catholic faith. In addition, the standards set forth by the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis call for parishes to develop a two year program for many of the same reason's listed above.

- Please tell me about your spiritual habits regarding daily prayer, Sunday Eucharist and care for the poor.
- Who have you chosen as your sponsor and why? What will it take for someone to choose you to be their sponsor?
- What are your plans to continue to grow in your faithful following of Christ after you are confirmed?
- How do you see your commitment to following Christ being challenged and tested over this next year?
- Who is going to support you and challenge you if you become weak or lax in living your faith?
- How are you being called to be of support to your peers in living our Catholic faith?
- What is the strongest statement you can make about your commitment to Jesus Christ?
- What ministry or volunteer position in our parish have you chosen to keep you growing in your Catholic faith?
